Bulky sweaters are a pain to store. For fine sweaters, use a pack-it bag or tissue. "It cushions the sweater and keeps the layers," explains the author of *Smart Packing for Dummies*. A good item that keeps sweaters from wrinkling helps organize them is a pack-it bag like Eagle Creek's Pack-It Folder or Victorinox's Swiss Army PakMaster. Fold sweaters around the thin inner packing board—the clever design holds everything in place. No shifting means no wrinkles!

Q I don't want rings on my new coffee table. Where can I get cool coasters?

"Look for coasters that are eye-catching," says event planner Steve Kemble. "Don't worry about matching the furniture." Brightly colored ceramic or acrylic coasters are very trendy and wipe clean easily. In general, adds Kemble, make sure coasters are heat- and water-resistant and have nonskid cork backing. "Without a protective backing," he explains, "coasters can do as much damage to your furniture as cup rings would!"
